

# Bunwell Primary School



Pupil Premium Statement 2017-18

For the financial year 2017-18 Bunwell Primary School has been allocated £21,120 Pupil Premium funding. Primary schools receive £1,320 for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years. Primary Schools receive £1900 for children who are Looked After.

### **Barriers to Learning:**

**Behavioural, mental and social health well-being needs:** some of our children have challenges with managing their emotions and interacting with others this can impact on their learning and well-being

**Diversity:** 25% of Pupil Premium children are from ethnic minority families, a further 25% of Pupil Premium children have experienced early trauma in their lives. Some of the children need targeted support in order to catch up with their peers.

**Social Care Needs:** 25% of Pupil Premium children are, or have been, supported by Social Care. Parents and carers need support from school to address their needs and to support their children's learning.

**Life Opportunities and Experiences:** some of the children benefit enormously from the extra-curricular opportunities which the school can offer to raise aspirations, widen their knowledge and enhance their learning.
