### **What is Pupil Premium?**

The Pupil Premium is additional funding provided to enhance the education of key groups. It is paid to schools for each student who:

- Is recorded as being eligible for Free School Meals in the last six years
- Is Looked After
- Has a parent serving in the Armed Forces

For the financial year 2017-18 Bunwell Primary School has been allocated £22,400 Pupil Premium funding. Primary schools receive £1,320 for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years. Primary Schools receive £1900 for children who are Looked After and £300 for Forces children.
