


Bunwell in Brief

Safeguarding at Bunwell

Headteacher News

As we move into 2020 the fight against single use plastics continues. Schools have been urged to eliminate single use plastics by 2022 by making small changes. It is important that we teach our children sustainable practices and try to start simple habits which allow us to reduce the waste we are producing. It is reported that the habit of 'lunch on the go' is generating nearly 11 billion items of packaging waste a year, much of which is not recycled. At Bunwell, for example, the children's milk comes in recyclable bottles rather than individual cartons which are not recyclable. Our hot school dinners are plastic free, arriving in metal trays which are washed and used daily. As are the plates and cutlery we use. Time is often tight when preparing packed lunches and it can be easier to put together a lunchbox with prepacked food and individually wrapped items and still ensuring that children get a nutritious lunch. However, studies have shown that making small changes such as buying in bulk and using reusable containers can save money and reduce waste.

There are many lunchboxes and tubs available now which have lots of little spaces for different items which eliminates the need for individual wrapping or packaging.

I have noticed that some children who bring in packed lunches from home use paper bags to wrap their sandwiches or have lunchboxes with little compartments for the different things they have. It is small changes like these which combine to make a big difference.
