Headteacher News

Welcome back to the new school year! It has been really lovely to see all our children and families after the summer holiday, as well as welcoming new starters throughout the school. I have been so pleased to see these children settle into their new school quickly and happily.

We have returned to more routines and timetables and children do not have to stick to their bubbles. The staff have been pleased to all be able to share one staff room again! We do still have safety measures in place including regular hand washing, increased ventilation and enhanced cleaning to help minimise the risks of Covid transmission. We do ask that if parents or visitors are coming into the school building that you still wear a mask to help us reduce the risk further.

The children have a very exciting curriculum at Bunwell with lots of opportunities for hands on learning, being outside, going on trips etc. We hope to be able to take the children on as many trips as possible after nearly two years with COVID restrictions preventing us from doing so. We will share more information about what we have planned in due course.

Please have a look at the curriculum letter that I shared on Dojo last week to see what your children will be learning about this term. This also has important information such as when PE lessons are and what you can do at home to support your child's learning.

Children should now come to school with a book bag every day and they will be given a reading record and reading books that they will bring home. All children are expected to read for 20 minutes every day at home. Please sign their reading record to show they have done their reading each day. The class teacher or TA will check this and get in touch with any parent if their child is not reading regularly. Supporting your child with their reading at home not only helps them make progress but also encourages reading for pleasure which is one of the most important things that can improve children's attainment at school in all subjects. Parents in Ladybirds and Hedgehogs will be invited to a reading meeting next week to discuss early reading and how we teach this at school; we hope you can attend.

Hello and welcome back everyone! It is so nice to see all the children back in school and the warm weather has returned too to help us ease into the new school year! Thank you to everyone who has continued to follow the guidelines in place. We hope a cautious approach will help us ease into the next phase of dealing with life living with Covid and keep any disruptions to a minimum. Please remember that if any children need to isolate, the school does have a contingency plan (a copy is on the school website) so that children can (if they are well enough) access work whilst they are off, whether that is waiting for a test result, or because they have Covid-19.

In other non-covid news, the staff and children from across the Trust (all three schools) have started on an exciting new method of learning this year, which is very much aligned to our co-operative values. The new approach, which is called *catch1 partner*, goes back to basics in some ways. In a short burst it gets the children moving around their class, engaging with their peers, both asking and answering questions. This new approach will cement children's learning, improve recall and long-term memory, but most importantly it builds confidence and gets children used to interacting with their peers again. It is a ten minute routine which can be used across all subjects and classes. It will happen almost every day. Everyone has embraced it enthusiastically so far – hopefully some children have come home and been talking about it with you over dinner/tea – if not, do ask them about it. It is not a substitute for all the usual work in school, but something extra. We will monitor this closely and report back later in the year how it is embedding in.


Early Years – First Days of School
