### Hedgehogs:

We have had a busy few weeks in Hedgehogs! In English we have been designing and creating a leaflet for our own ice theme park. This linked to our art work, where we painted pictures of rollercoasters. In topic we have continued learning about the North and South Pole, with a particular focus on human/physical features. We have also watched a couple of documentaries and pretended we were scientists in the area!

### Foxes:

Foxes Class have written wonderful non-chronological reports about an animal of their choice from The Amazon Basin, which ties into with their work on variation and adaptation, leading to evolution, in science. In maths, they have been studying percentages and their relationships with fractions and decimals and in art they have been taking black and white photographs and using these to develop pencil sketches.

## Headteacher Update

Earlier this week, we marked Safer Internet Day. The internet is woven through every part of our lives now. There is rarely a day when we don't use the internet, whether it's for keeping in contact with friends and family, staying up to date with news and events, using social media, shopping or gaming. In school we would be lost without the internet; we use it to take the registers, for lesson content, keeping in touch with parents and families and for things such as Times Tables Rockstars.

This year the theme of Safer Internet Day is 'Want to talk about it?' and encourages children to speak up and share any worries about things they see online. It is important that we start conversations on a regular basis about staying safe online. If you are not sure where to begin, these pointers might help:

- Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online
- Ask them about how they stay safe online
- Ask them if they know where to go for help
- Think about how much time you each use the internet.

It can feel that children are a few steps ahead of us when it comes to knowing how to navigate the online world but there are some quick and easy things to put in place.

1. Set parental controls on your children's devices.
2. Set up safe search settings [https://safety.google/intl/en\\_uk/families/](https://safety.google/intl/en_uk/families/)
3. Set boundaries—it's never too early to start settings rules about when and for how long children can use their devices. The tricky thing is sticking to the rules!
4. Agree on boundaries about when and where they are allowed to use devices eg. Tech free meal times and no devices kept in their bedroom at night.
5. Check if a site is suitable—many social networking sites have minimum ages—visit the site yourself to see what the content is.

If you need support with setting up controls and parental devices, please let us know and we can support you to do this.

I have challenged the children to have a device free day over half term—some were more keen on this idea than others!

## Clubs

After half term, and for the rest of the school year, we will be running a range of after school clubs. These are the clubs which will be running between now and July, we will try and add more to the list as well!
