At the Cooperative Education East Trust, we value Art and Design as an important part of the children's entitlement to a broad and balanced curriculum. Art and Design provides the children with the opportunities to develop and extend skills and an opportunity to express their individual interests, thoughts and ideas.

Art, craft and design embody some of the highest forms of human creativity. A high-quality art and design education should engage, inspire and challenge pupils, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design. As pupils progress, they should be able to think critically and develop a more rigorous understanding of art and design. They should also know how art and design both reflect and shape our history, and contribute to the culture, creativity and wealth of our nation.

The National Curriculum for art and design aims to ensure that all pupils:

- 1. Produce creative work, explore their ideas and record their experiences.
- 2. Become proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques.
- 3. Evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design.

4. Know about great artists, craft makers and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms.

Early Years Curriculum

The EYFS framework is structured across seven areas of learning rather than subject areas like the National Curriculum. Our CEE curriculum provides discreet Art and Design lessons which link directly into our topics and build upon a sequence of skills and thought processes. Teachers in EYFS ensure skills taught take in what the children can already do and the curriculum provides structure which links into continuing skills in KS1 and 2. Pupils explore and use a variety of media and materials through a combination of child initiated and adult directed activities both in continuous provision and direct teaching. When planning for continuous provision, consideration is applied to resources to ensure a range of sensory experience, time is considered to ensure children can develop and extend ideas, opportunities provided to observe creations and the natural world to allow children to explore freely and be creative.

Experiences and opportunities include but are not limited to:

- Explore the textures, movement, feel and look of different media and materials
- Respond to a range of media and materials, develop their understanding of them in order to manipulate and create different effects
- Use different media and materials to express their own ideas
- Explore colour and use for a particular purpose
- Develop skills to use simple tools and techniques competently and appropriately
- Select appropriate media and techniques and adapt their work where necessary
